Do you know why we celebrate some of the events we do? February 16 marks the Restoration of the State, otherwise known as "V16" (first independance), where in 1918 the Council of Lithuania signed the Act of Reinstating Independence from the Russian Empire. March 11 marks the Restoration of Independance (second independance day) where in 1990 Lithuania re-established it's independant state after a 50-year Soviet occupation. June 14 marks Baltic Deportation Day, which is a day of mourning for the tens of thousands of Baltics who were deported by the Soviet Union in the 1940s. July 6 marks Statehood Day, which celebrates the coronation of the first known Grand Duke of Lithuania, Mindaugas and was the first step of the birth of the state of Lithuania.

Baltic Deportation Day

On 10 June, Canberra's Baltic communities joined the Ukrainian community at its regular demonstration outside the Russian embassy in Canberra to commemorate the anniversary of the forced deportations of Baltic citizens to remote regions by the Soviet Union between 1940 and 1953.

Members of the Lithuanian, Latvian and Estonian communities recalled historical detail of Josef Stalin's program, a program scarcely distinguishable from genocide, that had profound impacts on the psyches of these small Baltic nations that endure to this dav. The developments in Ukraine carry a further stark reminder of this past

oppression. The President of the Canberra Lithuanian Community read a speech from the Australian Lithuanian Community President, Rasa Mauragis. Rasa's speech reflected on the human toll of the deportations at the national and personal level and the need to never forget.

Of particular poignancy were personal stories shared by members of the Canberra Lithuanian Community (pictured above) which told of the impacts of the deportations on their families. Stories of family members rounded up who were tortured and killed. Some whose fate is unknown and many who never survived the transport, privation and inhuman conditions of their exile. And perhaps most profound were the stories of those who survived the horror only to return as broken human beings, broken in spirit and in health to a Soviet system that had no capacity or desire to support them, unable to adjust and often to an early death.

The commemoration concluded with the singing of national anthems and the ceremonial joining of hands by those present to recreate the 'chain of freedom' when two million people across Lithuania, Latvia and Estonia joined hands to form a human chain spanning 690 kilometres in a peaceful protest in August 1989. The appreciation of Australia as a safe haven for many of the world's displaced is implicit in events such as these. That we still commemorate these events so many years after shows the impact of these national and individual tragedies on Baltic nations.

The <u>Lithuanian Special Archive</u> has published the names of the people who were included on the lists of those who were to be deported in 1941 and 1945-1953. The lists are incomplete but can be searched by name.

2024 Australian Lithuanian Days

In December 2024, between Christmas and New Years, the Australian Lithuanian Days (ALD) and Sporto Švente will be held in Adelaide.

Mark the date in your calendars now, and be ready to participate in Lithuanian art, culture and sport with like-minded Lithuanians from around Australia. Last year's schedule hosted an art show, youth talent night, literature afternoon and a New Year's Eve party. Sports included basketball, tennis, golf, darts and more. Anyone can participate and we welcome Canberra representation in 2024.

Upcoming elections

There will be three elections in Lithuania next year.

In May 2024, citizens will be asked to vote in the Presidential election and in a mandatory <u>constitutional referendum</u> for multiple citizenship. In June 2024, there will be elections to the European Parliament, and in October, an election of Lithuanian Parliament (Seimas).

The ALB will work with communities around Australia to ensure locals can vote, including new arrivals and those holding citizenship. Those who have a right to vote are to register prior to the elections (details to be announced). In addition to the Embassy in Canberra, another live polling station will be available in Australia. Further details will be provided to members via email as information is received by the Committee.

Exchange Programs

Have you ever thought about an exchange to Lithuania? Below are some ideas to keep in mind for future exchanges.

The Council for the Patronage of Ethnic Culture has prepared information about **2023 summer camps** in Lithuania. These run yearly, so you have time to consider participating in 2024. Global Lithuania recently organised a professional "Kurk Lietuvai" program. There will be similar programs in the future. If an exchange program interests you, please let the Committee know so we can keep you in mind as we receive information about these programs.

Lithuania's society is getting more <u>involved</u> in **refugee matters**, according to the UNHCR.




